

Aboriginal Sector Communication Update

Thursday 14 May 2020 14:00 Hours

This regular communication update is to keep health professionals abreast of the state-wide resources that have been developed by the Department of Health for the Aboriginal community and health professionals for COVID-19.

COVID-19 Case numbers

- As of 14 May 2020, there are 554 confirmed cases of Coronavirus (COVID-19) in Western Australia (WA). 538 people have recovered.
- To date 61,267 COVID-19 tests have been conducted in WA.

National COVID-19 Aboriginal epidemiological profile

- Total of 55 cases (0.8%) of all Australia positive cases (6,784) notified in the National Notifiable Disease Surveillance System (NNDSS) were Aboriginal people.
- 11% (six persons) of Aboriginal people with COVID-19 were admitted into hospitals, compared to 13% (850 persons) for all positive cases.
- Among Aboriginal positive cases: 67% (37 persons) were from 'major cities', 22% (12 persons) were from 'inner regional area' and 11% (six persons) were from 'outer regional area'. To date there has been no Aboriginal positive cases and no deaths reported in the remote and very remote areas.
- 47% of Aboriginal positive cases acquired their infection overseas, 46% were infected domestically and only 7% are under investigation.
- The completeness of Aboriginal identification fields in the NNDSS dataset is around 95%, with 5% of cases recorded as 'not stated' or unknown status.
- The median age of Aboriginal positive cases was 34 years compared to 48 years for all Australian positive cases.


COVIDSafe app


